PUBLIC TRANSPORT ACCESS

Trams:

The Clocktower Centre is situated close to all public transport, Trams, Trains & Buses.

The nearest tram stop is located on Mount Alexander Rd, at 'the Moonee Ponds junction' corner of Pascoe Vale and Mt Alexander Roads. The tram stop number is 33.

The Route Number is 59 Airport West to Elizabeth Street, City, but any tram coming past will take you into central Melbourne

Trams arrive approximately every 10 minutes.

From the city, Route 59 trams depart from Elizabeth Street at the corner of Flinders St, again approximately every 10 minutes.

Trains:

The Moonee Ponds Train Station is conveniently located at the end of Puckle St (7 min walk) and is situated on the Broadmeadows Line.

Trains leave approximately every 15 minutes and go to both Spencer St and Flinders Street Stations, which are located in the city centre.

Taxis:

Taxi's are able to drop off and collect at the front doors to the building. There are an abundance of taxi's in the area and a blue phone in the Clocktower foyer.

Buses:

A bus terminal is located opposite the Clocktower Centre. The buses transport to the western and northern suburbs of Melbourne. The bus terminal is well sheltered and has public toilet facilities. Buses leave regularly with timetables posted for your convenience.
